Some Early History of the Nottingham Astronomical Society

Notes: The Nottingham Astronomical Society, which began its career in September 1921, held a public meeting on March 15, 1922, under the chairmanship of Mr. W. Malin Hunt. This society aims to spread the taste of astronomy to the public. On the occasion of this meeting, astronomical instruments, photographs and diagrams were shown, which were the subject of discussion and gave rise to very interesting explanations provided by W. E. T. Hartley. The president made the solar promenences a captivating subject illustrated by projection. Other lectures, also illustrated by projection, followed one another on various astronomical subjects. This meeting was a great success. We wish the development and prosperity of this commendable company [translated from French in 'Ciel et Terre' vol. 38, p.288-9 (Bulletin of the Société Belge d'Astronomie), Brussels, 1922].

Elected to RAS on 11 May 1906, proposed by Samuel Fellows, address 48-50 London Road, Nottingham [MNRAS vol. 66, p. 263].

3rd quarter 1902: William Malin Hunt married unknown in Nottingham.

1911 Census: William Malin Hunt, born in Nottingham 3rd quarter 1873. Age 37 years. Occupation: Machine Tool Engineer in Nottinghamshire.

Died: 21 November 1945.

Walter Edward Tomson Hartley

Elected to the BAA on 28 March 1923. Proposed by William T. Haskard, seconded by Leonard Mosley. Address: Sherwood Grange, Winchester Street, Nottingham [JBAA vol. 33, p. 211].

1911 Census: Walter Edward Tomson Hartley born in Skipton, Yorkshire 4th quarter 1878. Age 32 years. Occupation: Assistant Colliery Manager in Lancashire.

4th quarter 1915: Walter E. T. Hartley married Margaret Siddall in Upton upon Severn, Worcestershire.

Died: Edgbaston, Birmingham on 21 September 1935. Age 56. Probate to widow.

Leonard Mosley

Elected to the BAA on 29 January 1919. Proposed by William Haskard, seconded by Thomas Pool. Address: 44 Sandon Street, Nottingham Road, Nottingham [JBAA vol. 29, p. 66].
